Chair Ogelman called the meeting to order at 7:04 PM, The Pledge of Allegiance followed.

CITIZEN COMMENTS (first opportunity):

Chair Ogelman read comments into the record from Chris Grody, 816 Candle Ridge Court, opposing the Vineyard Square project.

DISCUSSION/INFORMATIONAL ITEM(S):

a. Historical Overlay Zone Ordinance

Chair Ogelman conducted a unanimous straw vote that a news release be sent out regarding the upcoming public hearing with a large map. Also the Historic Overlay Zone Ordinance be shared during the meeting on the projector to make live changes being discussed and with going forward in the same practice for other updates.

Don Dooley, Director of Planning and Economic Development, gave the report on the Historic Overlay Zone Ordinance highlighting the changes. Discussions were conducted by the Planning Commission regarding page 1 of the ordinance that "Upon recommendation of the Planning Commission that Town Council consider updates at least once a year, page 4 was to add the word "or" between "General interior or exterior" and between "foundation repair, or re-roofing" and striking the phrase "with the same materials that are already present on the roof". Mr. Dooley will check for interpretation from the town attorney on page 10 Section 7- Appeals fourth paragraph that the "person aggrieved" can approach any citizen or Commissioner or member or Council Member to represent them and for the town attorney to add any language if appropriate in this section following an email from Mr. Dooley after conversing with Ms. Hankins.

Chair Ogelman conducted a unanimous straw vote for staff to move forward on this ordinance with incorporation of what was discussed in the meeting and also to meet a deadline of June 25th for the letter distribution to property owners, and a planned public hearing for July 15th with the ability to take action the same evening as when the public hearing is held.

b. Project Plan Review

Chair Ogelman gave the report and a milestone was met for the C-4 Height Amendment.

PLANNING STAFF REPORT

a. Inquiries of Interest to the Planning Commission

Don Dooley gave the report that a pre-bid meeting on the RFP interests had been held with a deadline of offers on July 6th. Also, there was the addition of an item by staff on the Town Council Meeting June 22nd agenda of Substandard/Nonconforming Lots of Record in the R-2 and R-3 zones regarding lot consolidations and setbacks. This will be an action item for staff and Planning Commission to prioritize this item for discussion and provide Council with policy recommendations pertaining to this item.

Commissioner Bennett questioned if the same purchaser was under contract for the old Town Hall building and the property of Bridges on Main Street and was there a shared plan for these properties. Mr. Dooley confirmed that staff is aware of the same purchaser going under contract for both of these properties and when/if he knew of the plans for the properties he would update the Planning Commissioners by email.

COUNCIL REPRESENTATIVE'S REPORT:

Commissioner Milan, Town Council Liaison, confirmed that the C-4 Height Ordinance and the Budget FY22 was passed at the last Town Council Meeting.

PLANNING COMMISSIONERS' COMMENTS:

Commissioner Paciulli questioned two separate projects of townhomes on 21st St and referencing how they are shown on a map of the Historic Overlay. Mr. Dooley would research these properties in question.
